Their work for the Society has been immense. David will have completed 16 years as Treasurer and Lesley 22 years as General Secretary – an extraordinary 38 years of combined service for the Society!

So a new chapter is opening for the Society. Barbara Ford will be taking over as Treasurer, and Stephen Greenwood as General Secretary. Julie Greenwood will take over as Librarian from Jenny Brumhead who, although standing down from the post of Librarian will remain on the Committee. Sue White will become Vice-Chair at the AGM and will succeed me the following year. By the way, if any of you feel you would like to help the Society in a more regular way and can assist the Committee behind the scenes please do not shy away!

It is still a great privilege and honour to be the Chair of this wonderful Society. May it continue for the next 160 years!

### 'COME & SING' VIVALDI & RUTTER'S GLORIAS!



Don't miss our popular, annual Come & Sing one-day choral workshop on Saturday 23 April.

Hosted by WFCS, it's a fantastic day of music-making that gives both members and non-members the chance to try out even more of the 'choral greats'!

More than 100 amateur singers from across the UK are expected to take part in our annual workshop, which this year covers both Antonio Vivaldi's joyful masterwork, *Gloria*, and John Rutter's thrilling *Gloria*.

Participants don't need choral experience to take part, but being able to read or follow music is helpful to get the most from the day.

The workshop takes place in the convivial surroundings of St Andrew's Methodist Church in Pump St, Worcester.

We'll be under the baton of our esteemed former WFCS and Worcester Cathedral Director of Music, Christopher Allsop, with the brilliant Nicholas Freestone providing piano accompaniment.

Registration is from 9.30am, for a 10.15 start. After several singing sessions and breaks there will be an informal afternoon performance (including soloists) which participants' friends can attend free of charge. The day finishes by 4.45pm.

Tickets are £20 (adults) and £10 (students) which includes vocal score loan for the day, and free tea and coffee. There will also be delicious home-baked cakes to buy.

Singers can even pre-order a home-made packed or hot lunch when they book their ticket.



### PLAY THE WORCESTER COMMUNITY LOTTERY



Did you know that you, your friends and family can help support WFCS funds by buying tickets for the Worcester Community Lottery? Thanks to Worcester Community Lottery tickets bought by a small number of loyal supporters to date, more than £400 has once again been raised towards WFCS funds through this route in the past year. Several of our supporters have also won money and extra free Lottery tickets along the way. But with even more players supporting us, we could raise so much more!

- Worcester Community Lottery is a weekly online lottery that aims to raise money for local charities and good causes
- Every ticket costs £1. Of this 50p goes directly to the local charity selected by the player. A further 10p goes to other local charities
- The draw takes place every Saturday night at 8pm
- The top prize is £25,000 if 6 numbers are matched, £2,000 if 5 consecutive numbers are matched, and so on.
- The average odds of winning a prize are estimated at 50:1
- Minimum purchase is 1 month (5 wks') worth of tickets (£5 spend)

The book charting the illustrious history of Worcester Festival Choral Society, published to mark our 160th anniversary, has now sold more than 150 copies and raised £820 profit for the Society so far (with the considerable production costs also covered).


Copies of 'A Choral Chronicle - The History of Worcester Festival Choral Society' will continue to be available at rehearsals next season, and from our WFCS website meanwhile (www.wfcs.online/book) at the special direct-from-WFCS price of £20. 100% of the income goes to WFCS funds. Copies are also on sale at Waterstones Worcester, Worcester Tourist Info Centre, Worcester Cathedral Shop (rrp £25).

Charting the WFCS story from its Victorian origins to the present day via two World Wars, 11 conductors, hundreds of concerts and many famous-name connections, the 242-page, full colour book makes a fascinating read for any WFCS member or concertgoer. As well as drawing on a wide range of historical archives, the book includes 200+ colour images, plus anecdotes from long-standing Chorus members and many Directors of Music.

In it you can discover how WFCS was born in 1861; how Sir Edward Elgar led the WFCS 'Band', conducted WFCS concerts and chose us to premiere two of his choral works: the truth behind Conductor

Hugh Blair's unusual dismissal; how WFCS was guest-conducted by Sir Adrian Boult and Sir Hubert Parry; how WFCS helped the Second World War effort; why the WFCS 'Centenary Concert' was a mistake; how the Society sang at the Royal Albert Hall; how the music is programmed for WFCS and Three Choirs Festival concerts... and much more.

### **HEREFORD THREE CHOIRS FESTIVAL 2022**

Ever since Worcester Festival Choral Society's inception in 1861, many members of the Society have been selected to sing in the renowned Three Choirs Festival Chorus whenever the Festival has been held.

The same is true this summer, when 35 WFCS members who passed the special Chorus audition before the last Worcester Three Choirs Festival (the results of which then apply for the full cycle of three Festivals) will take part in Hereford from 23-30 July.

The theme this summer's Festival is 're-imaginings', with the renowned Philharmonia Orchestra in residence once again.



At the time of this publication, only the initial Festival preview has been published, however the full event programme – including which works the Festival Chorus will perform in its series of flagship evening concerts – is due to be announced very soon. Visit www.threechoirs.org for the latest updates.

Auditions for the next Festival Chorus cycle (ie from Worcester 2024 onwards) are not until autumn 2023, but to find out more, chat to our Three Choirs Festival Worcester chorus manager, Stephen Greenwood (B) in due course. 



# MEMBER MEMORIES FROM 40 YEARS AGO

"As a result of having to clear a bookcase under our stairs, which had long been a repository for what is politely called 'memorabilia', I discovered two of our society's programmes dating back to the early 1980s.

The first was dated 16 June 1980, which was the day we were all bussed up to London to sing *The Apostles* in the Royal Albert Hall; the concert was to raise funds for Sir Edward Elgar's Birthplace (see programme cover left). The second programme from 2 June 1981 was for a concert to celebrate the unveiling of the Elgar Statue which stands at the top of the High Street, opposite the Cathedral (see page from the programme bottom left). Both events were attended by HRH The Prince of Wales. The large glossy A4 programmes cost 50p and included advertisements for many long-gone Worcester businesses including 'Kays of Worcester' and 'The Metal Box'.

I was interested to note that at the time the Society boasted around 240 members, with tenors and basses being equally divided at 35 each. Clearly Health and Safety did not restrict the numbers on the seating at that time although I do seem to remember that it was rather unstable. The present structure with the restricted numbers is much more solid. Apart from my own name (then Miss Pugh) and that of my mother, I was intrigued to discover some names very familiar to me, a few of whom are still singing with us today.

Neatly folded in one of the programmes I discovered a copy of our very first WFCS newsletter dated May 1981. The following paragraph may be of interest: "One of the most heartening and productive features of the year has been the way members have rallied round in various ways to lift the society out of its financial crisis. From jumping out of aeroplanes to sponsored knitting, with much bring and buy and coffee in between and to say nothing of one of our ladies actually running in the London marathon, we have raised nearly £2,000".

Fortunately now our financial management seems to be in safer hands despite a few cancellations due to Covid and mishaps with the roof. However......"

There will be a Service of Thanksgiving for Victoria's life in Worcester Cathedral on Wednesday 23 March at 11.00am. A choir, directed by Sam, is being formed to sing at this service, with singers drawn from both choirs of which she was a member.

Our thoughts are with Victoria's husband Mark, her family and many friends.
