WELCOME BACK for our 161st SEASON! FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Following the, at times, very hot summer break, we are about to start our 2022-23 season.

During the summer, many WFCS members took part in the Three Choirs Festival at Hereford (see p9). It was a wonderful week of music, with many superb reviews praising the Festival Chorus. The choral highlight of the week for me was a recent work, Richard Blackford's *Pietà*. Sam was conductor, and as Worcester Chair it was lovely to hear many praising comments for the performance, including from Richard Blackford and the soloist Roderick Williams.

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Later on, at the end of August, a number of members took part in two 'Proms Spectacular' concerts, one in Hampshire at Stansted Park, and the other at the Three Counties Showground (see p10). I sang at the first event, and it was such fun. Huge thanks go to Michelle Whitefoot for organising everything, from rehearsal venue to music distribution etc. Audience and organisers were hugely appreciative of the wonderful sound that we produced.

So, onto this next season. In the autumn we will present Vaughan Williams's A Sea Symphony and Delius's Sea Drift. The Vaughan Williams is a particular favourite of Sam's, and as we all know we were due to perform it prior to the pandemic. This time it will be paired with the Delius, unknown to most of us, so will give us all a challenge. Then, as usual, we will start the festive season with Handel's Messiah. I wonder how many times you have sung it? I'll be onto my 20th performance (I think) - I never tire of it, and still find some bits which seem almost new! Next March we will perform Elgar's Dream of Gerontius. A perennial favourite for the Society, Worcester, and Worcestershire. As you can see, an exciting programme for the year. Tickets are already on sale, so do let your friends and family know. Posters will be out very soon, so do spread the word and help ensure that we sing to a full cathedral.

As we know there are many changes to the committee that will take place at the AGM. First of all a huge thank you to all members of the committee, but, here is my first, and most heartfelt thanks to David Norledge and Lesley Bellerby. Their support and professionalism has kept the Society running as a tight ship for more years than most can remember. I know that you will both thoroughly enjoy singing 'from the back benches'!

Also, David Norledge feels that it is right that subscriptions remain at £125 this year (see p3). The Society returned a surplus last year, and with many costs spiralling we felt that we didn't need to increase them. But it does mean, keep selling tickets!!

Finally, many members tell me how much they enjoy singing with the Society. There are all kinds of reasons, from the quality of music we produce and the professionalism of the team, to the guidance we have from Sam and Nick. However, it is mainly down to the members. We are all a friendly bunch from all parts of the County (and a couple like me from 'over the hills in Herefordshire'!) and from all walks of life. Singing together as members of the Worcester Festival Choral Society is unique. No two choruses are the same, and I like to think we are really rather special, so thank you one and all!

Tickets for all three of our concerts are available NOW!

We continue to develop our booking system, to keep up to date with current trends and make the booking experience simple and problem free.

Please go to our website wfcs.online to secure your chosen seats.

You can also use the TicketSource telephone booking service on 0333 666 3366 which is open weekdays from 9-7pm and Saturdays 9-5pm. They will have up to date availability.

Ticket prices range from £15 - £27 with the usual booking fee and you can also pre-order a concert programme to collect 'on the night', to avoid a cash payment.

For this coming season we are using the same cathedral seating plan with pews and chairs in the Nave but reserve the right to change seating selections if necessary.

TICKET DISCOUNTS FOR WFCS MEMBERS

- A discount of 20% is available if you book seats for all three concerts at the same time. This means £21.60 for a Front Nave seat which is really £27. What a bargain!

Thanks to Worcester Community Lottery tickets bought by a small number of loyal supporters to date, more than £400 has once again been raised towards WFCS funds through this route in the past year. Several of our supporters have also won money and extra free Lottery tickets along the way. But with even more players supporting us, we could raise so much more!

- Worcester Community Lottery is a weekly online lottery that aims to raise money for local charities and good causes
- Every ticket costs £1. Of this 50p goes directly to the local charity selected by the player. A further 10p goes to other local charities
- The draw takes place every Saturday night at 8pm
- The top prize is £25,000 if 6 numbers are matched, £2,000 if 5 consecutive numbers are matched, and so on.
- The average odds of winning a prize are estimated at 50:1

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WFCS SINGERS IN THE THREE CHOIRS FESTIVAL 2022

Continuing the annual tradition that has been part of Worcester Festival Choral Society's raison d'être since its inception in 1861, a contingent of 35, specially auditioned Worcester Festival Choral Society members had the privilege of singing in The Three Choirs Festival this summer - making up around a quarter of the renowned Festival Chorus.

Now in its 307th year, the Three Choirs Festival originated at the end of the 17th century, after visits by the lay clerks of Gloucester, Hereford and Worcester to one another's cathedrals for joint services and informal singing. Now an eight-day event typically involving around 1,000 performers presenting more than 100 choral and orchestral concerts, plays, talks and services, this year's Festival took place in Hereford from 23-30 July. The Worcester members of the Festival Chorus, who attended intensive rehearsals from May onwards, were trained by Samuel Hudson with Nicholas Freestone accompanying. Hereford Cathedral's director of music Geraint Bowen was the event's overall Artistic Director.

This year the Festival Chorus sang in the Opening Service and five of the Festival's flagship evening concerts in Hereford Cathedral, many of which attracted sell-out audiences of 1,000+. Accompanied by the acclaimed Philharmonia Orchestra and world

class soloists such as soprano Dame Sarah Connolly, tenor Nicky Spence and baritone Roderick Williams, the Festival Chorus's critically-acclaimed performances included Dvořák's Requiem, Dyson's Quo Vadis, Poulenc's Stabat Mater, Elgar's The Dream of Gerontius, and one of the first performances of Pietà, an exciting work by British composer Richard Blackford. 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WFCS MINI-CHORUS IN TWO PROMS SPECTACULARS!



Following an invitation earlier this year from outdoor events organisers BelEvents, a chorus of 30 singers from Worcester Festival Choral Society had the chance to perform in two, impressive Proms Spectacular outdoor picnic concerts in August, providing a refreshingly different singing opportunity and some excellent local PR.



The concerts took place at Stansted Park stately home in Hampshire on 20 August, and Malvern Three Counties Showground on 27 August. Each event attracted an audience of more than 2,000 concert-goers, who were treated to a full evening of entertainment including an Army parachute display, Spitfire acrobatics, a swing band, and of course an exciting, Proms-style orchestral and choral concert – complete with impressive, synchronised fireworks display.

The WFCS 'Proms Chorus', which pre-rehearsed with Nicholas Freestone and Christopher Allsop as well as the concert conductor Ben Ruffer (Captain in Royal Corps of Music), performed rousing classics including *Zadok the Priest, O fortuna, Land of Hope and Glory, Jerusalem* and 'Anthem' from *Chess*, and *Nessun Dorma* alongside renowned tenor Oliver Johnston. The London Orion Orchestra also performed.



Thank you to all our singers who took part in these two, extremely memorable occasions!










