FEATURE: JONATHAN DOVE'S FOR AN UNKNOWN SOLDIER

WFCS concert - 18 November 2017

For An Unknown Soldier, which WFCS will be performing at our autumn 2017 concert, is a Cantata of remembrance to mark the centenary of the First World War. It was commissioned by Portsmouth Grammar School and the London Mozart Players. It was first performed on 9 November 2014.



On his website at www.jonathandove.com Jonathan Dove describes the inspiration and structure of the piece.

He drew his initial inspiration from letters of wartime shown to him by the archivist of Portsmouth Grammar School, John Sadden. He then selected and set poems of wartime as letters home from the soldier at the front, and from the soldier home.

Jonathan Dove writes: "From my reading, a sequence of poems gradually emerged which suggested to me one man's journey through the war: beginning with enthusiasm and the decision to enlist; going on to discover the reality of war, and finding death on the battlefield; the grief of those left behind ... Particularly in the First World War, the experiences of men and women

were quite different, so I have set some poems for male voices only, or female voices only. I was aware that I was writing for young voices near the age of many of those who fought, as well as for children."

Four of the poets whose work Dove selected died in the war, among them Wilfred Owen, William Noel Hodgson and Charles Hamilton Sorely. Ivor Gurney survived gassing, but with his mental and physical health wrecked. Women poets featured include Helen Dircks and Marian Allen.

For Worcester Festival Choral Society, the opportunity to perform *For An Unknown Soldier* will be a welcome return to the work of Jonathan Dove, particularly in such timely commemorative circumstances. We remember from our performance in November 2014 of Dove's *There Was a Child*, which he attended, this composer's striking facility with contrasting moods of music and the ability to set poetry arrestingly.

There is one recording of *For An Unknown Soldier* available, on Signum Classics, at www.signumecords.com or through the special <u>WFCS Link</u> to Amazon (WFCS receives a donation of 10% of the sale, at no cost to you). The recording features Nicky Spence (Tenor) the London Mozart players, the Oxford Bach Choir and Portsmouth Grammar School Chamber Choir, conducted by Nicholas Cleobury. It is paired with the ensemble's performance of Dove's An Airmail Letter from Mozart, directed from the piano by Melvyn Tan.

The Choristers of the Cathedral Choirs will be performing "There Was A Child" at this year's Three Choirs Festival in Worcester on Thursday 27 July.
